The mission includes the institution's broad expectations concerning the education that the students will receive, including the acquisition of the body of knowledge presented in the education program, the development of intellectual, analytical, and critical abilities, and the fostering of values such as a commitment to pursue lifelong learning. Our objective is to successfully educate our students in accordance with our mission and transform it into measurable student learning outcomes for our phlebotomy program. You will be instructed by our patient, friendly and caring staff.*

Our Program Director is a Physician Assistant/CPT-1. He has many years of experience in the medical field and is an outstanding instructor. All our staff are licensed and experienced Certified Phlebotomy Technicians (CPT-1) with years of experience in hospitals, laboratories, and clinics. WTI provides students with a complete 80-hour course of instruction in the field of phlebotomy: 20 hours of basic didactic education, 20 hours of advanced didactic education, and 40 hours of clinical externship, in accordance with California State requirements. We proctor the National Test, required for both National Certification and State Licensure.

The course will include the following: Syllabus, power point handouts, scrubs, and a personal name badge. Students will be expected to perform live punctures on each other in a controlled setting. Live lectures including state of the art audio visual presentations of assorted topics including Arterial Blood Gases. Our qualified staff will build self-confidence, teach professionalism, and encourage students at his/her own pace.

Wagner Training Institute will provide a convenient 40-hour clinical externship. Students will be placed in area hospitals, clinical laboratories, or clinics to complete the requirements. Demonstration of competency is required prior to extern placement. In addition, scheduled time for lab sessions will be available in the office during the week, by appointment only.

Wagner Training Institute is a private institution which has been approved to operate by the California Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education and Department of Health-Laboratory Field Services. Admission Policy:

The minimum requirement to attend the Phlebotomy Program at Wagner Training Institute is to be at least 18 years of age and have completed high school or completed college or acquire a General Education Development (GED) from an accredited institution. Wagner Training Institute has not entered into an articulation or transfer agreement with any other college or university.

In the event any hours are missed, students will be responsible for make-up hours.

Classes are instructed by licensed medical professionals, teaching experience in phlebotomy for over 25 years, are CPT1 licensed and approved by the State of California Laboratory Field Services with Department of Public Health.

2. The Standard Occupational Classification code for this institute is 31-9097.

The building is approximately 3800 sq.ft.; we have a large classroom; 4 main offices; one break room.

The supplies included for students use: Syringes, Vacutainers, Evacuated tubes, Tourniquets, needles, Sharps containers, gloves, masks, gowns, artificial arm/hand, butterfly’s, capillaries and Centrifuge for processing samples.

3. **CANCELATION REFUND Policy** This Institution shall refund 100 percent of the amount paid for institutional charges, less a reasonable deposit or application fee not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250), if notice of cancellation is made through attendance at the first-class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.

The institution shall refund for the return of unearned institutional charges if the student cancels an enrollment agreement or withdraws during a period of attendance. The refund for students who have completed 60 percent or less of the period of attendance shall be a pro rata refund. The institution shall pay refunds within 45 days of a student’s cancellation or withdrawal. The 45 days shall begin from the date when the enrollment agreement is signed.

4. **WITHDRAW REFUND Policy** The amount owed shall be no less than the total amount owed by the student for the portion of the educational program provided subtracted from the amount paid by the student, calculated as follows: The amount owed equals the daily charge for the program (total institutional charge, divided by the number of days or hours in the program), multiplied by the number of days student attended, or was scheduled to attend prior to withdrawal.

5. LEAVE OF ABSENCE Policy

There may come a time when you will need to take a leave of absence, from the program. Leave of absence request in writing may be directed to Wagner Training Institute 1030 Nevada Street, Suite 201 Redlands, CA 92374 Attention: Judy Wagner. If you take a leave of absence from your training, and it exceeds 12 months, you will be required to re-enroll and be subjected to the current fees.

6. Probation and dismissal Policies: Students who miss full or partial days are required to make up the missed hours during a subsequent month prior to advancing to the next segment of the program. If a student does not make up the missed hours during the subsequent month, the student will be on probation and will have 12 months to complete missed hours at no charge. After 12 months, the student will be dismissed for the current program. If the student wishes to complete the program after 12 months, then he/she must re-enroll in the program and will be subject to any increase in tuition fees.

1. Disclosure: Wagner Training Institute is a private institution which has been approved to operate by the California Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education. Approval to operate means the institution is compliant with the minimum standards contained in the California Private Postsecondary Education Act of 2009 (as amended) and Division 7.5 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations.
2. Annual updates may be made using supplements or inserts accompanying the catalog. If changes in educational programs, educational services, procedures, or policies required to be included in the catalog by statute or regulation are implemented before the issuance of the annually updated catalog, those changes shall be reflected at the time they are made in supplements or inserts accompanying the catalog.
3. Prior to enrollment, this institution shall provide a prospective student, either in writing or electronically, with a school catalog containing, at a minimum, all the following: the name, address, telephone number, and, if applicable, internet web site address of the institution.
4. This institute has additional offsite locations: 1) 350 Terracina Blvd, Redlands, CA 92374; 2) 26520 Cactus Ave, Moreno Valley, CA 92555; 3) 1910 E. Central Ave., San Bernardino, CA 92408. **(Currently not in use).**
5. Retention of student records: All student records are stored in the corporate office located at 1030 Nevada Street, Suite 201, Redlands CA 92374. In accordance with State regulations, Wagner Training Institute will retain student records for a period of 5 years after the student withdrawal date or graduation date. The student transcripts are retained permanently. Academic and Financial records are maintained in separate files for a period of 5 years.
6. Children and pets are not allowed to attend the classes. Students are required to be attentive and participate. Cell phones and electronic devices are to be turned off and recording devices are not allowed.
7. Standards for student achievement: Students shall be required to attend the full duration of the course in accordance with California state laws and regulations. This consists of a full 20 hours of Basic Didactic instruction, 20 hours of Advanced Didactic instruction, and 40 hours of Practical Training in a clinical setting. Upon completing both the Basic and Advanced Didactic training, students are eligible to continue with the clinical externship portion of the program. Upon completion of all three steps of the program, students are given a certificate of completion. The students are now eligible to sit for the National Certifying Examination and apply for State Licensure. Students, who have greater than 40 hours of previous on-the-job experience in phlebotomy, as described by State guidelines, are required to attend on the Advanced Didactic portion of the program, provided they can produce accurate documentation of said experience. Students are required to document attendance at each class by signing in on an attendance tracking sheet each day of class. Students shall sign in on the same line in each of three columns representing the three days in each didactic segment. Attendance is monitored throughout the duration of the class and sign-in sheets are kept on file at the school's main office in Redlands, CA. Students who miss full or partial days are required to make up the missed hours during a subsequent month prior to advancing to the next segment of the program. If a student does not make up the missed hours during the subsequent month, the student will have 12 months to complete missed hours at no charge.
8. The Standard for student achievement for the phlebotomy program (eg: grading rubric) for internal test & quizzes.
9. Testing is based on a letter grade: **A 90-100% / B 80-90% / C 70-80%**. Any grade lower than 70% is not considered passing and the student will need to retake the quiz or test.
10. The National Health Career Association (NHA). The standard for student achievement for the National Test (eg: grading rubric). The passing score for the NHA (CPT1) examination is a 390-500. The scaled score is a conversion of a candidate's raw score on a test that allows for comparison between different forms of the same examination. The use of a scaled score provides consistency in reporting passing standards by accounting for the difficulty level of the examination form.
11. Students can be expelled from the program without refund for the following reasons: Any student using profanity, inappropriate/unprofessional behavior, or any student dismissed from the phlebotomy program for just cause.

12. Wagner Training Institute reserves the right to modify program dates and locations for each course (basic and advanced) without notice to meet operational needs. This does not apply to students who have already signed an enrollment agreement.
13. The students also have access to AK Smiley Public library in the city of Redlands, which is 1.9 miles from our site. The address for AK Smiley Public library is 125 West Vine Street, Redlands, CA 92373. The student also has access to the library's learning resources online via their website at <https://www.akspl.org>.
14. California Department of Public Health Laboratory Field Services may require a criminal background check. Failure to disclose pertinent information prior to registration, including felonies or misdemeanors will result in no refund.
15. The health care profession operates under a strict drug-free policy. To perform their duties, health care workers must be focused and unimpaired safely and effectively. It is our policy, therefore, that all students are subject to random drug testing. Any presence of illegal drugs or narcotics in a student's system is grounds for dismissal from the program without refund. By signing this form and enrolling in the course, you agree to this policy.
16. After completing the application to the State for the CPT1 license, students will no longer be covered under the school liability insurance and will not be able to return for extra stick practice, etc.
17. The Office of Student Assistance and Relief is available to support prospective students, current students, or past students of private postsecondary educational institution in making informed decisions, understanding their rights, and navigating available services and relief options. 22. The registration form is legally binding when signed by students and accepted by Wagner Training Institute
23. Wagner Training Institute does not offer distance education programs.
24. Wagner Training Institute does not provide housing for our students. Housing is available within a few miles of the school; the approximate cost of housing located near the school is around \$800 to \$1200 for a one-bedroom apartment. This institution does not find or assist a student in finding housing.
25. Wagner Training Institute does not provide any placement services.
26. Wagner Training Institute does not provide any visa services for foreign students.
27. Wagner Training Institute does not offer the award of credit for prior experimental learning.
28. Wagner Training Institute's manner of language for instructional purpose is English and does not offer any other languages for instruction.
29. Wagner Training Institute requires a student to be proficient in English at a high school level. Foreign students are required to provide any translated document, which can show the high school level equivalency.
30. Wagner Training Institute has no pending petition in bankruptcy, is not operating as a debtor in possession, has not filed a petition within the preceding five years, or has not had a petition in bankruptcy filed against it within the preceding five years that resulted in reorganization under Chapter 11 of the United State Bankruptcy Code (11 U.S.C Sec. 1101 et seq.).
31. **NOTICE CONCERNING THE TRANSFERABILITY OF CREDITS AND CREDENTIALS EARNED AT OUR INSTITUTION:** Wagner Training Institute has not entered into an articulation or transfer agreement with any other colleges or university, the institution shall disclose that fact. (CEC 94909 (a)(B)(A) and 5, CCR 71770).
30. This institution or any of its programs are not accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education.
Wagner Training Institute does not participate in Federal and State financial aid programs. If the student has received Federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of money not paid from Federal student financial aid program funds.

If the student obtains a loan to pay for an educational program, the student will have the responsibility to repay the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund. Further, if the student defaults on a Federal or State loan, both the following may occur:

The Federal or State government or a loan guarantee agency may act against the student, including garnishing an income tax refund; and the student may not be eligible for any other government financial assistance until the loan is repaid.

31. Student Recovery Tuition Fund (STRF)

“The State of California established the Student Tuition Recovery Fund (STRF) to relieve or mitigate economic loss suffered by a student in an educational program at a qualifying institution, who is or was a California resident while enrolled, or was enrolled in a residency program, if the student enrolled in the institution, prepaid tuition, and suffered an economic loss. Unless relieved of the obligation to do so, you must pay the state-imposed assessment for the STRF, or it must be paid on your behalf, if you are a student in an educational program, who is (a) California resident, or are enrolled in a residency program, and prepay all or part of your tuition. You are not eligible for protection from the STRF, and you are not required to pay the STRF assessment, if you are not a California resident, or are not enrolled in a residency program.”

(b) In addition to the statement required under subdivision (a) of this section, a qualifying institution shall include the following statement in its school catalog:

“It is important that you keep copies of your enrollment agreement, financial aid documents, receipts, or any other information that documents the amount paid to the school. Questions regarding the STRF may be directed to the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, 1747 North Market Blvd., Suite 225, Sacramento, CA 95834 (916) 574-8900 or (888) 370-7589.

To be eligible for STRF, you must be a California resident or are enrolled in a residency program, prepaid tuition, paid or deemed to have paid the STRF assessment, and suffered an economic loss because of any of the following:

(c) The institution, a location of the institution, or an educational program offered by the institution was closed or discontinued, and you did not choose to participate in a teach-out plan approved by the Bureau or did not complete a chosen teach-out plan approved by the Bureau.

(d) You were enrolled at an institution or a location of the institution within the 120-day period before the closure of the institution or location of the institution or were enrolled in an educational program within the 120-day period before the program was discontinued.

(e) You were enrolled at an institution or a location of the institution more than 120 days before the closure of the institution or location of the institution, in an educational program offered by the institution as to which the Bureau determined there was a significant decline in the quality or value of the program more than 120 days before closure.

(f) The institution has been ordered to pay a refund by the Bureau but has failed to do so.

(g) The institution has failed to pay or reimburse loan proceeds under a federal student loan program as required by law or has failed to pay or reimburse proceeds received by the institution more than tuition and other costs.

(h) You have been awarded restitution, a refund, or other monetary award by an arbitrator or court, based on a violation of this chapter by an institution or representative of an institution, but have been unable to collect the award from the institution.

(i) You sought legal counsel that resulted in the cancellation of one or more of your student loans and have an invoice for services rendered and evidence of the cancellation of the student loan or loans.

To qualify for STRF reimbursement, the application must be received within four (4) years from the date of the action or event that made the student eligible for recovery from STRF.

A student whose loan is revived by a loan holder or debt collector after a period of noncollecting may, at any time, file a written application for recovery from STRF for the debt that would have otherwise been eligible for recovery. If it has been more than four (4) years since the action or event that made the student eligible, the student must have filed a written application for recovery within the original four (4) year period, unless the period has been extended by another act of law.

However, no claim can be paid to any student without a social security number or a taxpayer identification number.”

Steps to obtain your Phlebotomy License (CPT1)

Students will meet the State requirements of 80 hours through our state approved program.

STUDENTS WILL NEED TO COMPLETE ALL THE FOLLOWING STEPS FOR THEIR CPT1 LICENSE

1. Complete 20 hours in person, Basic Phlebotomy course fee \$600

2. Complete 20-hours in person, Advance Didactic Phlebotomy course fee \$600

3. Complete 40-hour in person, Clinical Externship fee \$700

Students will document 50 successful venipunctures and 10 successful skin punctures. during the 40 hours. Clinical hours will need to be completed Monday - Friday 8am-5pm consecutively, unless prior arrangements are made. We will provide hours for all students to attend a check-off session, prior to being placed in a clinical site in addition extra practice hours in the office

***Please note: Due to insurance liability and contracts with clinical sites, all students will need to complete the 40 hrs. clinical through Wagner Training Institute approved sites.**
